Section E: Project Summary

heART of Community Mural Project is a participatory project to be created during Cleveland's summer celebration in August. Under the supervision of established muralist, Len Davidson, community members of all ages will work together to create a 10' x 12' mural in the small park in the center of downtown. Combining the CAC's 2008 theme - "heART" and the Cleveland Days' theme - "Rolling on the River", participants will each paint a big puzzle piece which, when combined with the other pieces will create a colorful and surprising work of art that will grace the park for the rest of the summer. The project has the support of the Cleveland Chamber and the Cleveland Main Street Project, as well as local businesses. The mural will be installed on the park wall in such a way that it can be moved to a permanent location at summer's end.

Section F: Public Service Activity

What public notice of the activity will occur:

The project will be publicized in promotional materials about Cleveland Days, as well as CAC's regular newsletter and website. In addition, a newspaper article about the project will be published in the local paper in advance of its start-up. The directing muralist/artist will also produce a flyer in advance of the project, explaining the unique approach and inviting participation. This information will be made available to the community at the CAC sponsored Music in the Park series held on Friday evenings in the same downtown park.

Where will the activity occur:

Eddie Park is a small, recently renovated park in the center of downtown Cleveland. It is home to the summer Concerts in the Park series, and, just last year, became the site of a 13' abstract public sculpture. The park serves as gateway to Cleveland's access to the Bauer River that runs through town. The park will provide the perfect setting for this project. The permanent location for the finished mural is yet to be determined.
