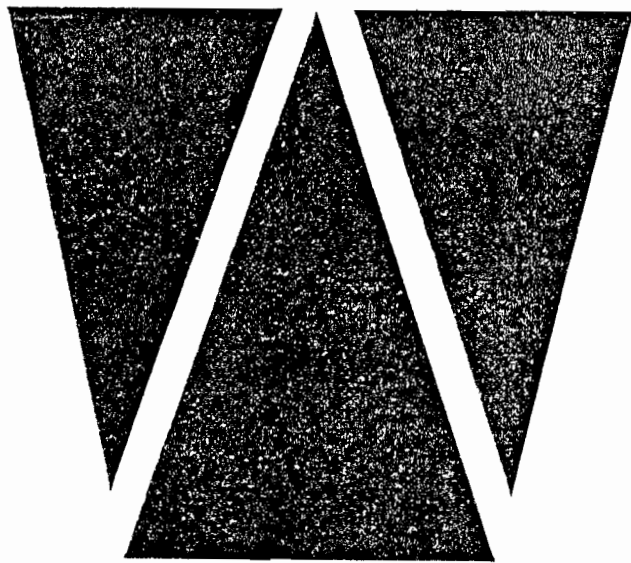

GENERAL GRANTS PROGRAM

The General Grants Program in Fiscal 1978 continued the growth it began in 1974, the program's first year of operation. Unfortunately, severe financial limitations prevented the program, as they have in the past, from fully addressing the needs that it faced.

Given tight fiscal restraints, the General Grants Program served a wide cross-section of Wisconsin arts. Approximately 3,607,925 arts contacts resulted from the \$270,753 granted under this program through performing arts tours, televised arts events and public art works, as well as individual artist project grants and fellowships. All monies awarded under the General Grants program are matched by locally raised cash and in-kind services. In Fiscal 1978, the match amounted to \$1,259,621, or more than five times the amount of Arts Board monies awarded.

The Arts Board's decision system relies upon a three-tiered process. The first level of review utilizes peer review panels, composed of experts in each of the disciplines; this panel examines the artistic quality of the applications. The second level of review, undertaken by Arts Board staff, examines administrative capabilities, geographic distribution and consistency with Arts Board policy. After these initial reviews, the Arts Board itself makes the final decisions.

COMMUNITY ARTS PROGRAM

Wisconsin Arts Board grants to twenty community arts agencies helped build the local support base for arts activities throughout the state. Projects funded by the Community Arts Program reached over a quarter of a million people in Fiscal Year 1978 according to grantees' final reports. Each dollar awarded was matched by an average of \$4.31 in local monies, and new state GPR funds coupled with a National Endowment for the Arts grant to the Arts Board, brought the total program allocation to an all-time high of \$51,500 for Fiscal 1978.

In addition to grant awards for arts projects and management consultants, the Arts Board sponsored NETWORKING, a statewide conference for community arts leaders. The conference agenda emphasized the ways in which community arts agencies can share programmatic ideas, development methods and cooperate in the booking of tours. The conference provided a forum for issues relevant to community arts agencies and gave participants the opportunity to practice effective leadership techniques. A number of state and national organizations which promote and serve the arts sent publications, displays or representatives to the NETWORKING Conference at the Yahara Center in Waunakee, Wisconsin.

Increased grantsmaking reflects the continual strengthening of existing community arts agencies and the formation of new groups in communities where they had not existed before. In 1976, grants were awarded to eleven community arts councils compared to twenty in 1978. There are more eligible applicants with professional paid managers and administrators, more visible local arts programming, and active volunteer participation in community arts projects. Arts Board staff assists in the formation of community arts agencies and provides assistance in the administrative and programmatic development of local agencies at their request. The Board surveys the activities of community arts agencies on a yearly basis incorporating the findings in the Community Arts Program planning.

A summary of projects funded by this program and the amount of the award gives an idea of the range of activities sponsored locally.

ARTISTS - IN - SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Wisconsin education administrators, teachers and students have made an increasingly enthusiastic response to A.I.R. programs and a record number of schools participated in Fiscal Year 1978. As a result, the Wisconsin Arts Board has already in the first half of the biennium, more than met its biennium goal of increasing by 10% both the number of A.I.R. residencies and the number of participating artists. Twenty-eight artists -- filmmakers, visual artists, actors, poets and creative writers -- worked in A.I.R. programs at some one hundred and twenty-five schools across the state in eighty-nine separate residencies.

Artists-in-Residence is an ongoing program of the Arts Board which is funded through competitive application to the National Endowment for the Arts and an allocation provided by the State of Wisconsin. The program involves professional artists, students, parents and teachers in the cooperative effort of developing and enriching students' sensitivity to and understanding of the arts, and provides an experience that encourages further arts programming and integration of the arts into the regular school activities and, ultimately, the community. The Arts Board grants provide partial funds for artists' fees, supplies and materials and other project-related costs. Program allocation for Fiscal Year 1978 totalled \$61,000.

The Arts Board has required that fifty percent of the cost of the residencies be borne locally. In the Spring of 1978 the Arts Board was able to offer five-day poetry residencies with a 10% local contribution to project costs. This special widely publicized program was made possible with the arts agency's first allocation of GPR funds for grantsmaking. Seventy-six applications were received, and available monies made possible thirty-six subsidized residencies.
